The Fair is open to 22,000+ Towson students as well as alumni from all majors where employers will have the opportunity to recruit for full-time jobs and internship positions. County to Purchase Radebaugh Property in Towson

Baltimore County Executive Kevin Kamenetz announced that the County will acquire 2.5 acres to be used for passive parkland in Towson.

Terrific news for Towson - one our office has been pushing for six months. I thank the County Executive for his support!

Baltimore County announced plans to purchase property owned by CM and JL Radebaugh Company, LLLP in con-

junction with the Radebaugh Florist Shop at 120 E. Burke Avenue.

The property located off of Aigburth Avenue across from 120 E. Burke Avenue is currently used for warehouse and greenhouse space for the flower shop that will remain in operation. The County is purchasing the property with local Program Open Space funds for \$1.1 million, a price determined by two independent appraisals. The property is zoned for residential development, and this purchase prevents the development of this area.

In April, Kamenetz announced a \$4.2 million project to expand the Courthouse Gardens to Patriot Plaza between the Historic Courthouse and the Towson Courts building. The Patriot Plaza project will involve removing the existing fountain and concrete pavers, adding green space and a park setting. The 40-year old fountain was shut down last year after persistent leaking into county office space that is sited underneath the fountain.

"I am very pleased to be able to add more passive open space in Towson," said Baltimore County Executive Kevin Kamenetz. "Adding this space to the recently announced expansion of the Courthouse Gardens provides residents with two very nice areas to enjoy with family and friends right in the heart of Towson, and represents an investment of over \$5 million for new parks in downtown Towson."

"This is great news for the community," said 5th District Councilman David Marks. "I want to thank County Executive Kamenetz and his staff for working so hard to complete this transaction, which will add open space in a densely-populated part of Greater Towson." The contract of sale is scheduled to go before the County Council at its legislative session on August 3.

\$1.6 MILLION LOANS AVAILABLE TO SMALL, MINORITY AND VETERAN-OWNED BUSINESSES

Flexible Funding

More flexible loan funds are now available to small, veteran-, minority-and women-owned businesses with \$1.6 million in new funding for the Baltimore County Boost Fund. A total of \$1.38 million in small business loans already has been approved since the program launched in October 2014.

Loan funding comes from the Maryland Small, Minority and Women-Owned Business Loan Fund, which was established with revenue from Maryland casinos.

The next round of Boost loan funds is available to help businesses in Baltimore County and throughout the State.

How Loans Can be Used

The Boost Fund, managed by the Baltimore County Department of Economic and Workforce Development, can lend qualified small businesses between \$50,000 and \$250,000 for start-up and gap funding, building and leasehold improvements, business and equipment acquisition, commercial real estate acquisition and working capital.

Boost Fund loans are flexible, with a reduced down payment and interest rates set at or below market rates. Payment plans are customized to meet the cash flow needs of each business.

Suite of Business Resources

"The Boost Fund is a valuable addition to the County's business resources, which include free employee recruitment and training programs, site selection assistance and a suite of financing options. Baltimore County stands ready to support companies when they are ready to expand and add jobs," said Will Anderson, director of the Baltimore County Department of Economic and Workforce Development.
