

Rotary Clubs of Towsontowne-Hunt Valley and Aberdeen Support Char Hope Foundation's Addiction Recovery Mission

Forest Hill, MD: The Rotary Club of Towsontowne-Hunt Valley recently welcomed Derek Hopkins, Executive Director of the Char Hope Foundation, along with Women's Program Director Tonya Adams, to share the Foundation's innovative approach to addiction recovery. Located in Harford County, the Char Hope Foundation operates a residential program that blends the National Ag Literacy Outcomes with the renowned 12 Steps of recovery. Through its Rooting Recovery initiative, participants engage in hands-on activities such as homesteading, gardening, commodity marketing, equine therapy, and general farm life. This agriculturally based model creates a safe and supportive environment for residents to experience healing through vulnerability, trust, self-reliance, and personal growth.

Club members were deeply moved by the Foundation's success and asked how they could help. Derek explained that the program needed two display freezers for the Hope & Wholesale Grocery Store, operated by Char Hope residents at 121 Industry Lane, Suite 7, Forest Hill, MD. The freezers were presented to Char Hope on September 17th at 9 am at Hope & Wholesale Grocery Store.

Hope & Wholesale is an important part of the recovery process, as it encourages community connection and service. The store partners with wholesalers and distributors purchase overstock, near-to-date, and close-out food products at reduced costs. These savings are then passed on to Maryland families, veterans' organizations, fraternal clubs, assisted living operators, church groups, and schools—helping them stretch grocery budgets and reduce costs for fundraising events.

Funding was provided by the Rotary Clubs of Towsontowne-Hunt Valley and Aberdeen with matching grant funding received from Rotary District 7620. In addition, John Babila, President of National Foodservice Sales at Magili Industries, heard Char Hope's story and provided a generous discount. This collaboration is a powerful example of Rotary's mission in action: bringing people and resources together to make a lasting difference in the community.

MD 45 (York Road) Roadway Improvements and Water Main Replacement Project

Construction Work and Temporary Lane Closures Beginning Fall 2025 for Water Main Replacement and Roadway Improvements in Towson

The Maryland Department of Transportation State Highway Administration (SHA), in collaboration with the Baltimore County Department of Public Works and Transportation (DPWT), is beginning the construction phase of the MD 45 (York Road) Roadway Improvements and Water Main Replacement Project in Towson. The 0.5-mile project extends along York Road from Newell Avenue - 300 feet south of the Towson Bypass/Burke Avenue intersection - to the Towson Roundabout at E. Joppa Road and MD 146 (Dulaney Valley Road).

Project Overview

Thepurpose ofthe joint project is to replace the county water main under York Road and upgrade the roadway, sidewalks, driveway entrances and drainage inlets and pipes along 0.5-mile of York Road to improve highway safety and traffic operations, pedestrian accommodations and bicycle connections. The scope of the \$9 million project includes:

- replacing the existing Baltimore County water main within the project limits;
 - upgrading existing traffic signals, intersection lighting, signage and pavement markings;
 - upgrading sidewalk ramps to be compliant with Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements;
 - reconstructing commercial business entrances within the project limits to be ADA-compliant and
 - replacing damaged inlets, installing new infrastructure as needed, cleaning pipes and drains and replacing or cleaning existing storm drain pipes.

How will work impact York Road traffic flow?

Most of the construction work on this project, such as water main replacement and roadway repair and resurfacing, will be done overnight. Work that may be done during daytime hours includes replacement of concrete sidewalks, curbs, gutters and driveway entrances. On-street parking along the right lane of northbound and southbound York Road may be temporarily prohibited during construction work.

Lane closure hours

Overnight single- and double-lane closures along York Road may occur any time Sundays through Thursdays between 9 p.m. and 5 a.m. the next morning.

SHA advises drivers traveling through Towson on York Road to destinations south of Towson University and north of the Towson Roundabout to use alternative routes at night.

How will the work affect York Road pedestrian access?

Pedestrian access will be maintained to all properties within the project limits at all times during construction. The construction team will coordinate activities with property owners to minimize disruptions. An ADA-compliant pedestrian path will be provided during sidewalk reconstruction and curb ramp replacement at the signalized and unsignalized intersections. Crews will work mostly at night to limit the impact on pedestrian travel.



How will the work affect York Road bus stops?

During construction, busstops on YorkRoad in downtown Towson for Maryland Transit Administration (MTA) buses, the Baltimore County Loop – Towson Circulator Bus, Towson University Bus and the Baltimore Collegetown Shuttle Bus may be affected by temporary lane closures. Bus stop locations may be temporarily shifted or relocated due to construction work on the roadway and/or sidewalks. No bus stops will be eliminated.

When will construction work be completed?

SHA,BaltimoreCounty DPWTand contractorPessoa Construction Co. will make every effort to complete this project as quickly as possible while minimizing impacts on residents, businesses and travelers. 




